Possible Visit to RAF Leeming on Tuesday, 13 October 2009

- 1 I am writing to inform you of a possible visit to RAF Leeming on Tuesday, 13 October 2009. I am still waiting for confirmation, but clearly need to start my planning for it now.
- 2 The visit is open to older members of the CCF who have been in uniform for over a year; priority will go to the RAF Section, but I would very much like to take some Army and RN cadets as well. I will make my selection on the order that cadets return the consent form to me; a copy of this letter is on the school web-site.
- 3 We would leave school promptly at 0845 on Tuesday 13 October 2009 for RAF Leeming, near Scotch Corner. Cadets would have to be smart both in their hair and uniform since we will be visiting an operational Service establishment. We would leave there at 1700, returning to LRGS soon after 1900.
- 4 There will be no charge for the coach, but I may have to make a small charge for lunch and afternoon tea.
- 5 There is a maximum number of 40 cadets on this visit, where we will see the workings of the RAF station, including aircraft sheds, workshops, radar and fire station; I would very much hope that the cadets got a chance to talk to some of the pilots about their work and training.
- 6 I have no more detail at present, but will let those selected have further details once I have confirmation of the trip. If your son would like to be one of those who attends, please return the attached consent letter as soon as possible.

CONSENT FOR THE POSSIBLE VISIT TO RAF LEEMING.
