
## SCHOOL PRIORITIES 2023-24



### Opportunity for every pupil

- (a) Provide high-quality support for pupils with particular pastoral and mental health needs, based on clear understanding of their vulnerabilities
- (b) Support the broadest possible extra-curricular programme and ensure its financial sustainability by increasing income for our sporting programme and the Annual Fund
- (c) Help all pupils to access curricular and co-curricular opportunities, especially those eligible for the pupil premium and 16-19 Bursary Fund
- (d) Further develop careers education for all year groups, and trial work experience

#### Curriculum, feedback and progress

- (e) Focus on feedback: Make sure that assessments link to precise knowledge that pupils need to remember, and help pupils to learn effectively from feedback
- (f) Pupil progress: Develop our use of value-added data and help every group of pupils to make excellent progress
- (g) Use academic pupil voice to reflect on teaching and learning in all subjects, with focus on prior learning and sequencing at key stage transitions (Year 10 and Lower Sixth)
- (h) Clarity of curriculum intent: Review and fine-tune schemes of work to ensure appropriate consistency and detail, with particular focus on Year 8

#### No bystanders

- (i) Teachers to use school systems in a consistent way to record and respond to behaviour issues, to promote the highest standards of pupil conduct
- (j) Ensure that an effective pupil working body, fully supported by staff and governors, promotes a culture of equity, diversity and inclusion at LRGS
- (k) Ensure that our school culture does not tolerate any type of sexual harassment, and that staff and pupils are confident to act on concerns
- (I) Environmental responsibility: Pupils, staff and governors to agree plans to promote sustainability and monitor our environmental impact

#### Independent and reflective students

- (m)Support pupils to reflect on their work so that they are better able to plan, monitor and evaluate their learning in each subject, and are motivated to improve
- (n) Teach all pupils effective strategies so that they are empowered to revise successfully
- (o) Maintain momentum as every subject promotes the whole school literacy strategy so that pupils read, write and speak like an expert in all subject areas
- (p) Prepare students and teachers for the new UCAS application procedures
