Rugby tour 2023

We were delighted to be able to take 71 players to South Africa for this year's rugby tour. In addition to training sessions and matches, the group enjoyed lots of additional activities including surfing, going on safari, exploring Cape Town, Table Mountain and shark cage diving! Congratulations

GCSE



Congratulations to our 2023 Y11s who collected their GCSE results in August. We are delighted to report that more than half of all pupils gained at least seven grades 7, 8 and 9 in their GCSEs (the equivalent of former A and A* grades). 39% of results across all subjects were awarded the very top 8 and 9 grades. Twenty-five students celebrated seven or more GCSEs at grade 9, including five students who achieved 10 or 11 GCSEs at grade 9. Three boys gained eleven grade 9s and eleven boys gained nine or more grade 9s. Headmaster Dr Chris Pyle said: "It is fantastic to see the energy and hard work of all our pupils recognised in their excellent grades. Congratulations to our students on an excellent set of GCSE results, which will be a springboard to their further success at A-level and beyond.

"We are proud of every single one of our pupils.

Congratulations both to the highest achievers and to all who have worked hard for such well-deserved results.

"It is a privilege to work with such motivated students. I am very grateful to all our teachers as well as support staff at Lancaster Royal Grammar School who have helped our pupils towards these achievements."

A Levels

Many congratulations to all our Sixth Form students who received their A Level results. Almost half of all results were A* or A grades (48.2%), and well over two thirds of all results (70.4%) were A*, A or Bs.

Seven pupils achieved four A* grades and ten others achieved three A*s. Headmaster Dr Chris Pyle said: "Huge congratulations to every single one of our students on these outstanding A-level results. It is excellent to see our students progressing to a wonderful array of university courses, degree apprenticeships and other opportunities."

"We are immensely proud of our Sixth Formers – girls and boys, boarding and day – for all they have achieved over the past two years. Some have come through particular challenges. They have also contributed hugely to the life of the school beyond the classroom."

Over the last year the Biology
Department has expanded to welcome
their very own bee colony.
The project has been supported by funds
from the Friends of LRGS and donations
from Y7 parents and fundraising
activities to purchase hives and
equipment, along with a very kind
donation of the bees themselves from
Gresgarth Hall Apiary.

Staff have undertaken training over the last year including; face-to-face theory, looking at bee equipment, training via Zoom to learn more about bees and practical training in the Apiary with Lancaster Beekeepers Association. Thank you to everyone who has provided support in establishing the LRGS Apiary, especially to Calvin Routledge who

continues to tend to gardens around school and helps provide flowering plants for our bees.

The project continues to grow and as Mrs Hargreaves and Mr Millatt become more experienced, they intend to involve more pupils in Bee Club.

Biology has embedded some lessons about bees into the KS3 curriculum and have run a World Bee Day with external expert visitors and honey tasting. Other activities include bee treasure hunts around school, cake sales and much more!

We have not completed a whole year of beekeeping yet, and we still have things to put into practice, especially looking after the colony over winter. All being well our single hive will need splitting next spring, and we will grow to two hives.

We hope LRGS can continue to bee happy for a long time to come!

Tony Joyce

It is with sadness that we share the news of the death on 21 July, at the age of 93, of Tony Joyce, LRGS Headmaster 1972-83. His funeral took place on Friday 18 August 2023 at 2 p.m. at Oxford crematorium. From Merchant Taylor's School in London, Tony went to Cambridge. He served as an engineering and instructor officer in the Royal Navy during the 1950s, before teaching science and maths at Oundle, Clifton, and Magdalen College School (where he was Usher or Deputy Head). In 1972 he succeeded John Spencer at LRGS, retaining LRGS's selective status and building the indoor Sports Hall. He implemented many modernising curricular reforms before moving on in 1983 to be Headmaster of Plymouth College. Tony kept LRGS very dear to his heart. He enjoyed a long and fulfilling life shared with his first wife, Jennifer and his second, Kate -- both of whom predeceased him. Tony enjoyed return visits to the LRGS Founders' weekends and, though

increasingly immobile, remained alert and inquisitive. He was, to the last, ever-eager for news from East Road and took a boyish delight in the successes of our pupils, past and present.

LRGS has lost a deeply significant former leader and lifelong supporter.

Dr Robert Greenwood Walton

We are sorry to report that OL Robert Greenwood Walton (35-40) passed away earlier this year. Robert's daughter, Betsy Walton, has written the following tribute

"Robert Greenwood Walton, M.D., of Modesto, California, met his goal of living a century when he celebrated his 100th birthday on February 13, 2023. He passed away on April 21, 2023, at his beloved Frank Lloyd Wright home, where he lived for 62 years.

Dr. Walton was born in Burnley, England, UK. He served as a Captain in the British Army of the Rhine, 1946-1948. A graduate of the University of London (Guy's Hospital), Stanford University and University of Michigan, Dr. Walton was a board-certified dermatologist who had a large practice in Modesto. Also, as, professor of dermatology at Stanford, he started and managed several skin disease clinics. Dr. Walton is known for several scientific papers that introduced new concepts that changed previous theories. Polo was his



passion. He was past president of the United States Polo Association and was instrumental in growing the sport of outdoor and indoor polo. All six children played polo and three of his sons were internationally rated polo players. On a local level, Dr. Walton founded the Modesto Polo Club and supplied the field."

Dr. Walton is survived by his six children and three great-grandchildren and our thoughts are with them at this time.
