The Boys in the Boat



We were absolutely thrilled when OL Joel Phillimore (01-08) got in touch last year to let us know about both his and fellow OL Andrew McMahon's (06-13) involvement in George Clooney's latest film, The Boys in the Boat. Joel plays Gordy Adam, a member of the University of Washington's rowing team. Andrew was a rowing double and heavily involved in training the team. The film documents the team's journey which started during the Great Depression through to the 1936 Olympic Games.

Despite the glitz and glamour of the movie world, Joel continues to keep in contact and support school in a variety of ways. Joel has also very kindly written an article about his experiences during filming of The Boys in the Boat, an extract of which, can be read below.

Joel writes, "One thing to know about

being a professional actor is that you have to handle a lot of rejection. On a daily basis. Since the start of the pandemic, most of the audition process has moved online with 'self-tapes' being the first step on the road to potentially landing a role. Self-tapes involve setting up a camera, lighting and a backdrop in our own home, roping in a friend, partner or family member to read in lines with you; then sending the tape off into the cloud to be watched, assessed and judged by a whole series of individuals. Sometimes you book a job from your tape. Sometimes you book a 're-call' from your tape. Most of the time you hear nothing at all......."

"I'm grateful for my fellow boys in the boat. If you speak to anyone that has rowed crew they'll tell you the bond between oarsmen and oarswomen are forged in sweat, exhaustion and blisters. It's a bond that you can only really comprehend when you feel it...."

"This bond is clear to be seen in the film. I think it's one of the elements that gives the film so much of the heart and soul that audiences have loved (as evidenced by the 96% audience rating on Rotten Tomatoes).

I'd love it if you had chance to support your local cinema and watch this film on a big screen, where it belongs. I'm sure you'll enjoy it as much as we enjoyed making it."

Dennis Glen

We were sad to learn that OL Dennis Glen (41-44) passed away on 3rd December 2023, surrounded by his family. Dennis' son, Dr Nigel Glen writes "After a mischievous childhood, Dennis ran away to sea in the second world war, being slightly economical with the truth about his age, and served on oil tankers (because the pay and rations were better). He somehow survived being torpedoed and sunk off Halifax, Nova Scotia, courtesy of U-1232. After the war he was selected to join the Fleet Air Arm as a pilot, but having studied metallurgy at Kings College he instead chose to remain with Imperial Chemical Industries (ICI), becoming their youngest ever Sales Manager. He thoroughly enjoyed his business career, collecting a wealth of anecdotes over the years. He



retired as General Sales Manager, Pacific, based in Tokyo. Much to the delight of the Taxman he returned to the UK, settling in Devon with his devoted wife, Beryl, who survives him. As do his two sons, Gary and Nigel and his Grandchildren, Lauren and Oliver." Our thoughts are with Beryl, Gary and Nigel at this sad time.

Ian Park, CBE

We were saddened to learn that newspaper executive, OL Ian Park CBE (49-53), passed away in December 2023 at the age of 88, following a lengthy illness. Upon leaving LRGS, Ian attended Queens College, Cambridge becoming a reporter at the Aberdeen Press & Journal when he graduated in 1959. Ian later became assistant literary editor at The Sunday Time and then managing director and editor-in-chief of the Liverpool Daily Post and Echo. In 1982, Ian was invited to become the managing director of the regional news giant Northcliffe Newspapers Group. Ian was awarded a CBE in 1995 for his services to journalism and the newspaper industry. Our thoughts are with Ian's wife, Anne, son Adam and their family at this sad time.
