Coming soon: New Duchy of Lancaster Awards

Mobile device policy

Some pupils have recently had phones confiscated or received sanctions for issues with mobile phones. We have asked teachers to reinforce our mobile device policy with pupils:

- Years 7-11: Pupils are not allowed to use mobile phones or digital devices in school they must be turned off and in your bag. Your teacher may allow you to use your phone in lessons: it's their decision not yours.
- Sixth Form students: Can use your devices before 8.45am, and at break and lunch, and in the Sixth Form cafés. Your phone will be confiscated if you use it around school outside permitted times, or walk around school using it, including with headphones or buds. No student may photograph, film, or record a pupil or member of staff, or use their device in a way which causes issues or makes people feel uncomfortable.
