



A Level Syllabus and Assessment Structure:

In L6th we cover the topics of

<p>Required</p> <p>(Task Time: 3 hours- but little and often)</p>	<p>Spend time over the summer consolidating your Spanish grammar and vocabulary from GCSE. This will be crucial for a smooth start to the course. My area on quizlet is jkmspanish (www.quizlet.com) and the website www.conjuguemos.com is great for verb conjugation practice. www.languagesonline.com is also useful for practicing other aspects of grammar.</p>
<p>Highly Recommended</p> <p>(Task Time: 2 hours, but little and often)</p>	<p>Discover Spanish music on a streaming service: There are lots of Spanish playlists available to help you discover Spanish songs and artists. Find a Spanish song/band/artist you like and complete the gapfills until you can complete 'advanced' (or even 'expert'?!): https://lyricstraining.com/es Find some Spanish language podcasts that you enjoy and listen to them regularly.</p>
<p>Optional</p>	<p>Films to watch online There are lots of TV series and films to enjoy on Netflix and Prime if you have a subscription.</p>
<p>Optional</p>	<p>Reading; Try newspapers such as www.elpais.es or www.bbcmundo.com to engage with current affairs. www.newsinslowspanish.com can help you to listen to topical news reports in a more accessible way. You might also want to try reading a children's book that you are familiar with or listening to it as an audio book to start building up your reading and listening skills.</p>
