

Summer Exams- Predicted grades and appeals

- “Predicted grades for UCAS references are made by individual departments and are based on work throughout Year 12 and in particular the end of Year 12 exam. Unless there are exceptional and provable reasons, students will not receive a predicted grade more than one grade above the result of their summer exam at most.”
- Do not expect resits as a matter of course
- Predicted grades- released in September with opportunity to appeal.

UCAS 2025-6

UCAS is the central admissions system that all UK universities use: you fill in one form online, and it is shown to all the universities you choose (except for the section that states which other universities you are applying for – that is removed).

If you haven't done so already, go to www.ucas.com and have a look at the "applying to university" section. Go to the "filling in your application" section and read about how to complete your UCAS form. You can also follow this link to the specific page about how to apply for 2026 entry. When you follow the link make sure you choose "Applying for 2026 entry" at the top of the page. <https://www.ucas.com/applying/applying-to-university/writing-your-personal-statement>

You will need to choose up to five similar courses and know the course codes and institution codes for each. Look up typical offers and make sure your selection includes at least one course that you should get into comfortably – you will need to keep an "insurance" offer at the end, as well as a first choice. Remember that it is not a good idea to apply for courses that require higher grades than you are being predicted. While your predicted grades will be given to you in September, you should have a good idea based on the school policy about how we predict grades.

To start an application, follow this link, <https://www.ucas.com/students>. The screen should show a log in page with sign in or register. Choose Register.

Things to Remember:

Choices

- When you are registered and have access to your hub, you can start to research courses and universities.
- You will need to choose up to **five** similar courses, and know the course codes and institution codes for each.
- Look up typical offers and make sure your selection includes at least one course that you should get into comfortably – you will need to keep an “insurance” offer at the end, as well as a first choice.
- Look at the details closely – some require specific GCSE attainment
- Remember that it is not a good idea to apply for courses that require higher grades than you are being predicted!

- **Special Needs:**

- If you have any special educational needs or there are any personal circumstances the universities need to be aware of, please ensure that you fill in the box on the form. This appears in the “more about you” section

Qualifications

- **Fill in this section in reverse chronological order.** You need to enter all your A level subjects (GCE Advanced) with results as pending, due August 2027.
- You need to enter **all** your GCSE results and any other official qualifications, such as LAMDA or EPQ.
- Your qualification level is “Below honours degree...”
- Check your qualifications carefully – there are multiple options for GCSEs so make sure that the ones you select correspond to your certificates. Please note that iGCSEs are in a different category from standard GCSEs.
- We will be comparing the grades you enter with our records, so don’t inflate your grades.
- Plagiarism or dishonesty of any kind will be treated as a very serious matter by UCAS and the universities.
- We will **not** be in a position to check all of the exams boards so **you** need to get this right.
- **Make sure your form is up to date when you submit it** or you may get an offer that includes a subject you’ve dropped.

- The reference must be completed before the application can be sent to us.
- Deadline for most conservatoire undergraduate dance, drama or musical theatre courses. Check on the specific course to be sure.

What you need to do straight away

- Save UCAS.com as one of your favourites
- Register in the UCAS Hub, link to the school and to your tutor group. Complete the personal details section at least.

What to do before the end of term?

- Start your research and access your application
- Begin filling in sections on the UCAS form and qualifications on the application
- Attend a few (virtual) Open Days – three days off permitted through Sixth Form- form on website
- Begin to narrow down your top 4/5 courses
- Find out about entry requirements and possibility of scholarships
- Admissions tests
- Portfolios for some subjects?
- Appropriate work experience / visits / reading / research
- **Draft a personal statement on Unifrog and get some feedback**

Filling in your UCAS Form- Common Mistakes!

1. Make sure you use a non-school email when registering details, but make sure it isn't silly or rude.
2. Include a phone number so UCAS can contact you.
3. Please always put in a nominated access. You don't know what will happen in the summer and you may need someone to talk to UCAS for you. Most people use a parent.
4. Most people need a student loan to pay for things like tuition fees. Select "02 UK, CHI, IoM or EU student finance services". You will then be asked about student support arrangements. Select the county you live in, e.g. Lancashire.
5. Get your ULN number from your form tutor.
6. When you get to the qualification section, work chronologically backwards, starting with your A Levels first. You should mark these as "pending". Then include EPQs GCSEs and other qualifications.
7. Remember to put your end date for leaving LRGS as August 2027. If you put 2026, you won't be able to put your A Levels as "pending".
8. Those of you that did a Level 2 Further Maths Certificate need to include this separately. It is not a GCSE.
9. Make sure all of your GCSE grades are correct.
10. When the form asks "Please state the highest level of qualification you expect to have before you start your course"
